

Choosing the right paper


Using the right paper is key to getting the best results with sprays. The right surface lets sprays blend and move beautifully, while the wrong one can lead to frustration. Experiment and find what works for you to create stunning projects with confidence!

Wrong paper



When you choose the wrong paper, sprays soak in too quickly, leaving you unable to move the color around, which can result in unnecessary frustration.

Right paper



When you use the right paper, sprays sit on the surface long enough to blend and move beautifully, giving you vibrant, controlled, and amazing results.



Don't stop too soon. Add layers

STEP 1

Add your first layer of color. Add your first layer of color. Start by spraying your base color, covering the surface to create a foundation for your background.



STEP 5

Add drops of water using your sprayer, or spray water into your hand and flick it onto the paper for a more controlled effect





STEP 2

Add some water to get that color moving around. Lightly mist with water to help the color blend and flow, creating organic patterns and depth.



STEP 6

Use a heat tool or let it air dry to set the first layer before adding more color.



Dry that in place. Use a heat tool or let it air dry to set the first layer before adding more color.



STEP 7

Repeat the steps a few more times until you get the desired look you want. Be careful with adding too much color.





STEP 4

Add more color by splattering it onto the background. Flick or splatter additional color to create texture, interest, and a more depth
